Digital Schools of Distinction Graduation- Taita Taveta, Kenya

11th – 12th October. 20 secondary schools in Taita Taveta County were awarded e-Confident status under the African Digital Schools Initiative (ADSI) programme being implemented in the County. The programme leads schools through 4 stages of whole school digitisation from e-Initial to e-Enabled to e-Confident and, finally, to e-Mature. When the participating schools reach e-Mature stage, they will be classified as **Digital Schools of Distinction**. The school principals received certification in recognition of their lead roles in supporting their teachers to utilise and integrate digital technologies in their teaching. The programme has the enthusiastic support of the county education authorities, the Teachers Service Commission as well as the schools' boards of managements and parents' associations. Meeting with ProScola

28th November, 2019. ProScola,a Swiss-based start-up organized a virtual meeting with GESCI to discuss Applications they develop. One is the ProScola Teacher administration app which has multiple functionality for managing their work. It has essentially four main points of intervention: Administration and Management, Teaching and Coaching, Informing and Communicating and Creating and sharing lessons. The App is UNIX based, uses PHP and MySQL it can be in French, English or German and open for translation to any other language. They also have ProScola Safe Schools which offers a platform at basic, intermediate and advanced levels of functionality and connectivity to support a learning station/classroom for learners with intermittent access to teachers. It's a reconditioned lockable safe box with laptop, WIFI and screen made from recycled parts. It has the ability to play on defined schedule educational videos and lessons. Anyone with mobile device access in vicinity can access lessons if registered. It also offers a messaging system to involve other teachers – if central internet access is available. Teacher Futures Initiative Workshop - Nairobi Kenya

25th – 29th November, 2019. Educationists convened at the Kenya Institute of Special Education to develop resources to support secondary schools' inclusive Education in Kenya. The workshop was attended by consultants from the Open University, UK, education officers and directors of education from the MOE, the Teacher's Service Commission (TSC), the Kenya Institute of Curriculum Development (KICD) and the Kenya National Examinations Council. The main focus was versioning resources to integrate Inclusive Education Pedagogies into secondary schools, a Teacher Futures program for the Commonwealth of Learning. Its envisaged that the resources will support teachers in making secondary schools in Kenya more inclusive through technology-enabled school-based learning. Participants developed a common understanding of the key principles of inclusive education in Kenya. They adapted OER's relevant to inclusive education, in order to develop micro-learning resources. GESCI Set to Implement Teacher Futures Initiative in Tanzania

GESCI has partnered with the Commonwealth of Learning to implement the Teacher Futures Programme in 20 secondary schools drawn from the Morogoro region in Tanzania. The programme is expected to kick off in January 2020. The goal is to provide an effective, sustainable and replicable model of School-based Teacher Development (SBTD) that can contribute to addressing the issues of pedagogical integration of ICTs, declining quality, inadequate teacher supply, and very limited or non-existent integration of ICT in secondary level education in Tanzania. Tanzania Teacher Futures is a PROGRAM aimed at improving TEACHER QUALITY through an innovative SCHOOL-BASED TEACHER DEVELOPMENT model for sustainable development that is SCALABLE. Implementation of ELEARNING and MICROLEARNING using INTERNET and MOBILE TECHNOLOGIES is considered critical to quality teacher learning, besides other technology-based training offerings. What Nobel Prize Winners Say about Education

The 2019 Nobel Memorial Prize in Economic Sciences was just awarded to Abhijit Banerjee and Esther Duflo of M.I.T. and Michael Kremer of Harvard, three economists who have "transformed development economics" by pioneering new ways to study, and alleviate, global poverty. Banerjee, Duflo and Kremer emphasize the use of field experiments to apply the benefits of laboratory trials to their field of research. Their work includes founding the Abdul Lateef Jameel Poverty Action Lab (J PAL), a research center working to reduce poverty by ensuring that policy is informed by scientific evidence. African Union's Africa Coding Week 2019 launched

Twenty-eight female ICT teachers from fifteen African countries attended the workshop addressing the importance of women's role in shaping the digital world and the future of work. The workshop was the result of a collaboration between SAP, UNESCO, the Ministry of National Education, Vocational Training, Higher Education and Scientific Research of the Kingdom of Morocco and BMZ (Germany). Ghana: World Bank approves \$150 Million to improve Quality Education for Children in the country

The World Bank has approved \$150 million in financing to support the Government of Ghana to improve the quality of education for over two million children in low performing basic education schools, and to strengthen Ghana's education system. The Ghana Accountability for Learning Outcomes Project (GALOP) will support teaching and learning through modern in-service teacher training, and provision of learning materials. School-level support and resources will be strengthened, combined with improved community engagement. Kenya: Launch of the National Education Sector Strategic Plan

The Government of Kenya launched National Education Sector Strategic Plan (NESSP) 2018-2022, an all-inclusive, sector wide plan that spells out policy priorities, programmes and strategies for the education sector over the next five years. Private sector takes action to address the education data challenge in developing countries

The Global Partnership for Education (GPE) and two companies announced new partnerships to collect and use data to improve education quality in developing countries: **Econet** will focus on boosting capacity in information technology and data science with interested ministries in multiple countries. They will train Ministry of Education staff in data science; second data scientists to support Ministries' work in gaining meaningful insights from data in remote areas where Econet provides satellite coverage. **Tableau** will partner with education officials in the Gambia to develop pilot data visualization and analysis tools. They will provide company volunteers to work together with Ministry of Education staff.

GPE also announced two other major initiatives: **UNESCO's Institute for Statistics (UIS)** will lead the development of usability and capability specifications for educational management information systems. **The University of Oslo** will work with the Gambia's Ministry of Education to pilot an education management information system (EMIS) in targeted districts to support data collection, analysis and decision making.
